



Scientists and Engineers in Oregon, 2005

This profile summarizes the demographic, social, and economic characteristics of the 103,165 people in Oregon's science and engineering (S&E) labor force. In 2005, the unemployment rate for Oregon's S&E labor force was 4% and median earnings were \$53,080. Oregon ranked number 7 out of 50 states and DC in the share of people working in S&E occupations.







Share of labor force in S&E occupations

In 2005, IT workers accounted for the largest share of Oregon's S&E labor force (40%). Median earnings for IT workers in Oregon were \$55,160, compared with \$60,470 for IT workers nationwide. 16% of Oregon's IT workers were racial or ethnic minorities.
