Introduction

The 2010 Malawi Demographic and Health Survey (DHS), conducted by the National Statisical Office in partnership with ICF Macro, features demographic, household and population data for Malawi.

This pocket factsheet provides results from the DHS with a specific focus on youth ages 15-24. It highlights issues relevant to youth such as education, employment and labor, sexual and reproductive health, as well as health-influencing behaviors.
